Brno's extension complete after three years

After three years' of construction, the network in the Czech Republic's second largest city has been expanded and now spans 72 km including a new 650m tunnel.



Luxemburg approves tramway expansion in capital

Edinburgh trams start Leith Walk testing

Leith Walk testing has begun in Edinburgh and passenger service is expected to begin in late June 2023. The long awaited project has come in under budget.

First Fukuramu low-floor LRV enters service on Fukui Railway

Fukui Railway to take delivery of three F2000 low-floor trams. With a top speed of 70km/h, the new 1067mm gauge vehicles will service its 21.5km Fukubu line.
