New Welsh Rail Franchise and Cardiff Capital Region Metro

TramForward is cautiously pleased to note the first 5 years of plans for the Metro in the announcements about the new Welsh rail franchise to commence on October 14th 2018. The planned procurement of new rolling stock, infrastructure enhancements, and increases in services are all very welcome items.

TramForward is, however, very well aware that the announced improvements on existing rail lines are only the beginning of the more extensive multi-modal Metro network as identified on the Welsh Government website. *TramForward* is therefore intent on ensuring that the Welsh Government instructs Transport for Wales to pursue development work on the other Metro routes, so that construction work on them can follow on from the upgrade of the existing Valleys Lines.

In order to achieve best value from investment monies, there needs to be a continuous stream of work to keep key technical teams employed. A stop-start approach, with constant stand-downs, and subsequent restarts, is very wasteful.

Alan Wilkins, LRTA Area Officer, South Wales, said: 'This is the start of a potentially exciting era for public transport in South Wales. The melding of existing rail lines, with on-street extensions and TramTrain technology, portends huge economic benefits from greatly improved connectivity. *TramForward* looks ahead to working with all parties involved to ensure that development momentum is sustained into realisation throughout, and beyond the duration of the new franchise.'
